The Sanford School of Public Policy and the Duke Center for Child and Family Policy invite applications for the inaugural Pritzker Professor of Public Policy. This position will carry tenure at the Sanford School at Duke University at the rank of professor and is endowed by the J. B. and M. K. Pritzker Family Foundation. We seek a leading scholar in early child development and public policy. Mid-career scholars at the current rank of associate professor as well as senior scholars are encouraged to apply.

We anticipate that the successful candidate will have a Ph.D. in a relevant field such as psychology, economics, public policy, sociology, or public health, with active externally funded projects. The position will include half-time responsibilities devoted to the teaching and service missions of the Sanford School and half-time responsibilities to lead an independent program of research in the Center for Child and Family Policy. The successful candidate will join the Center's initiative in early childhood policy, with current active programs of research on topics such as the impact of early poverty on life course development, government nutrition subsidies, pre-kindergarten learning, infant home-visiting policies, and early education and childcare.

The Sanford School includes a full-time faculty of 60 and offers an undergraduate major, two masters programs, and a Ph.D. program.
